ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE NATIONAL ELECTORAL COMMISSION AFTER THE PRESS CONFERENCE HELD ON

5th DECEMBER 2010 AT 4:30 P.M. CET AT THE NEC'S HEADQUARTERS

On 5th December 2010 at 4:30 p.m. CET at the headquarters of the National Electoral

Commission, the second press conference on the day of runoff for the positions of reeves,

mayors and presidents of cities was held.

Deputy Chairperson of NEC, Judge Stanisław Kosmal announced that on the basis of

data obtained from 9 702 precinct electoral commissions until 3.00 p.m. CET, 2 482 026

ballot papers were issued, which constitutes 20.45% of the total number of eligible voters.

Judge Stanisław Kosmal summarized the turnout in individual provinces. The highest

turnout was registered in podkarpackie province (25.84%), the lowest in śląskie (16.2%).

Judge Maria Grzelka summarized the turnout in selected cities. The highest turnout

was registered in Sopot (34.09%), the lowest in Sosnowiec (11.08%).

Judge Maria Grzelka informed the journalists about incidental violations of election

silence. According to data obtained from the Operational Centre of the Chief Police Officer

between 11.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. CET, in total 15 cases of violation of election silence were

registered, consisting mainly of distributing leaflets. All notifications about violations of

election silence are constantly verified by the police.

Judge Stanisław Kosmal announced that the next press conference would take place at

the NEC's headquarters at 8.30 p.m. CET, during which information about the turnout and

course of voting until 7.00 p.m. CET would be presented.

I. Aggregate countrywide information

On the basis of data obtained from 9 702 out of 9 706 precinct electoral commissions, the National Electoral Commission announces that as of **3.00 p.m. CET** on 5th December 2010:

- 1. The number of voters eligible to vote in the elections, i.e. the number of voters included in the register of voters in precincts from which data was obtained, amounted to 12 139 211.
- 2. Ballot papers were issued to 2 482 026 eligible voters, which constitutes 20.45% of the total number of people eligible to vote in the elections.
